PRESENTATION DAY ASSEMBLY



HB2 CLASSROOM NEWS

HB2. Unyah - Creative Arts.

This term students in HB2 have made artworks in a particular way about experiences of real and imaginary things using a range of techniques and materials.



Rainbow print- Using oil pastels and a blue paint wash.

A rainbow is an arc of colours that spreads across the sky when the sun shines after it rains. There are 7 colours in each rainbow - red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo (bluish-purple) and purple (violet). Definition of rainbow - 'many bright colours'.

Blot pattern - using paint and oil pastels.

Objective- To mix primary colours to make a secondary. To define the symmetry of a shape using contour line patterns.


Discuss the secondary colour produced as a result of blending red & blue= purple, yellow and red = orange, and blue and yellow = green.

Using the 3 colours, in crayon, 2 primary and 1 secondary, draw contour lines around to define shape and symmetry.


