In HB5 we have done so much this year.



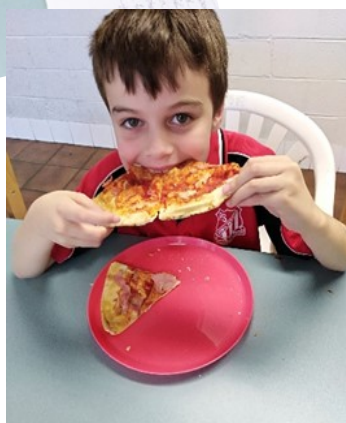
We raised mealworms and watched them transform into Darkling beetles. We had to look after them and feed them. We observed them shed their skin and become something completely different.



We work together to solve maths problems in class.



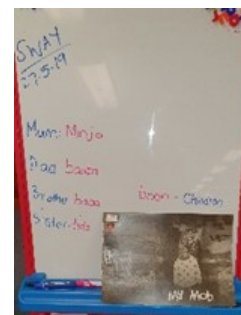

PRESCHOOL CLASSROOM NEWS

SWAY

During our planned SWAY program, the children were introduced to a book called, "My Mob". This is a story about a young girl named, Zeminda. Zeminda lives in Bowraville. We researched the location of Bowraville on a New South Wales map and discovered that it is in the Northern part of the state, near Coffs Harbour. We spoke about the "big banana" and referenced this as the nearest landmark to Bowraville. The children met some of Zeminda's family as she told us about them in the story. We learnt some of Zeminda's traditional Aboriginal language and learnt that her family is her mob. We discussed and wrote on our classroom ideas whiteboard, who lives in our house and who our family or mob is. We then used this information and transferred it to drawing pictures of each one of our family members. Our teacher's utilised resources (*endorsed from our local Aboriginal community, the Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG) and the Department of Education*) to teach us some of the local Aboriginal language (*Wadi Wadi or Dharawal*).



ELSA



The children participated in Elsa (STEM) activities during the day. Some of the concepts taught through play were, sorting sizes. The children applied their learnt knowledge to the activities on hand. The intentional teaching activity was sorting their heights, from tallest to smallest and smallest to tallest. Larger to smaller. Then they utilised the iPads to consolidate what they had learnt. Data collection when utilising the apps on the iPad are sent to Canberra University for data collection.



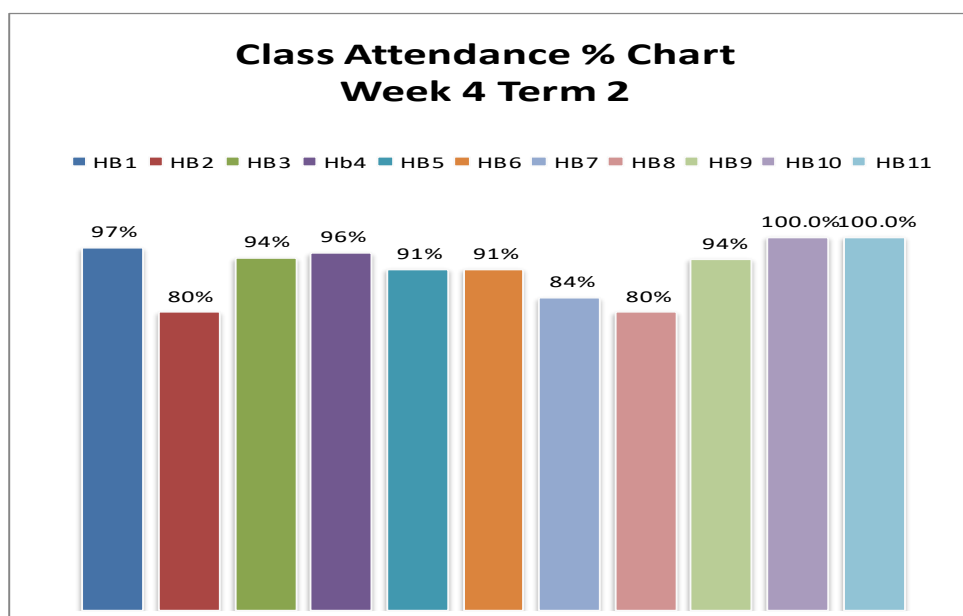
HEALTHY DRINKS
