#### High Potential and Gifted Students

Over the past 25 school weeks, 240 students from Helensburgh to Kiama Public Schools participated in our HPAG Extend classes across eight host schools in the Illawarra and Shoalhaven regions. Our goal is to foster curiosity, encourage discovery, and stimulate creativity among High Potential and Academically Gifted students.

This year, we take immense pride in recognising the dedication of one of our students, Ebe Apolo. To conclude this year's program, we celebrated with the Curiosity and Creativity Exhibition, where students shared their learning.

The afternoon began with students showcasing their learning journeys and performing the periodic table song, followed by presentations of their BlueScope Land Transformation projects. Guests had the privilege of exploring exhibits that ranged from artwork and coded games to film trailers, animations, websites, 3D models, information posters, novels, dioramas, and more.

Congratulations to Ebe for embracing a new and challenging learning environment, not just academically but socially and emotionally. We commend her efforts in exploring concepts beyond the typical primary school curriculum, delving into topics like the Big Bang theory, star formation, the emergence of elements, mathematical concepts introduced in years 7-9, 3D design, website building, and the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals. They also explored the world of leadership and tackled out-of-the-box thinking challenges!

#### How Parents Can Help


We encourage parents to actively participate in their child's summer learning journey. Set aside some time each day for reading, work on math problems together, and encourage creative writing. Create a cosy reading nook at home, visit the local library, or explore educational apps that make learning enjoyable. By making learning a family affair, you not only combat the summer slump but also create lasting memories.

#### In Kindergarten to Year 2 we use Synthetic Phonics-What is Synthetic Phonics

Synthetic phonics is an approach to teaching reading that focuses on breaking down words into individual sounds, or phonemes, and then blending them together to form words. It's like teaching children the building blocks of language. Instead of memorising whole words, children learn to recognise and manipulate the individual sounds that make up words. This method helps children grasp the essential connection between letters and sounds, laying a strong foundation for reading. By systematically introducing phonics rules, children gain the tools to decode unfamiliar words independently. In simpler terms, synthetic phonics is like giving children the keys to unlock the world of reading, helping them build confidence and literacy skills step by step.

#### Review: Where Will The Sleepy Sheep Sleep?



A book for bedtime reading, this tongue-twisting and somewhat mind-bending story will delight and entertain parents and children alike.

With its wonderful wordplay and tricky tangles, it's not for the faint-hearted! However, it definitely IS for those who enjoy playful language and a laugh.

Review: Bedtime Stories



If you're looking for some brilliant stories to read aloud at bedtime, or for independent reading, then Bedtime Stories by RA Spratt is a great go-to book.

It's a spin-off from the popular weekly podcast, Bedtime Stories with RA Spratt

In Bedtime Stories the book, you'll find 25+ short stories to enjoy.

There are tales shared by RA Spratt's character Nanny Piggins, and featuring another of her characters, Friday Barnes (in the case of the purloined pudding).

Re-telling's of myths and legends (Medusa) are mixed with fairy tales (The Ugly Duckling), contemporary stories (A Tall Tale About Bees ... And Alien Invasion), and history (The True History of Marie Curie).

There's also a short pronunciation guide which can be checked before, during or after reading aloud (words like Sheherazade). Plus, a map and a couple of recipes.

Reading at bedtime has multiple benefits for children of all ages. It supports having a bedtime routine, helps with relaxation and sleeping, and to reduce stress and anxiety. Reading together at bedtime is also a great joint activity for adults and children, and this is a great book for this purpose.

Bedtime Stories is packed with humour and inspiration for the imagination. Keep a copy handy for bedtime reading and anytime reading.

## **NSW Port Tour Excursion:**

On Wednesday the 15th November, students from Crimson, Celadon and Viridian attended the NSW Ports Tour. This tour took place around our local harbour and surroundings. We learnt about the vital role Port Kembla plays in exporting and importing goods around our country and overseas, as well as the role played in preparation and during World War 2. It was a great experience for our students, and they represented themselves and our school wonderfully.









This week, Stage 2 and 3 embarked on a tour of Port Kembla. We began our tour with a short visit to Greenhouse Park - where the full picture of the port was laid out beneath us.

Next, we entered the Inner Harbour where we saw the Port's key infrastructures - Port Kembla Coal Terminal (the second largest coal terminal in NSW), the Grain Terminals, the state's largest motor vehicle import hub and cruise ship berth.

After visiting the Inner Harbour, we travelled towards the Outer Harbour precinct – a short stop at Christy Dr, offering us a spectacular view of the Inner Harbour berths. Then we discovered the additional infrastructure and industries that are in and around the Outer Harbour. We finished our tour on a beautiful high at Hill 60 with amazing panoramic views of the Illawarra coastline, Lake Ilawarra and industrial super centre we have just explored.
